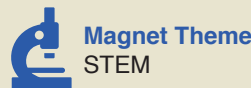


Project Overview

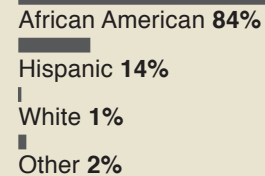
Board of Education City of Chicago 299, Chicago Public Schools, is adding to the district's K-12 science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) pathway by revising two K-8 magnet programs and converting a K-8 school from a traditional program to a STEM magnet program. The Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP)-funded project is preparing children to be inquirers and lifelong learners, and is emphasizing connections between classroom studies and the real world. The schools infuse technology into all content areas, implement K-8 engineering curriculum, and serve a diverse student population. The MSAP schools use the Multi-Tiered System of Supports to assist teachers in understanding the diverse needs and learning styles of students and to inspire engaged learning for all. The project is committed to embracing a holistic educational model that will prepare students for college, career, and life.

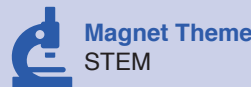

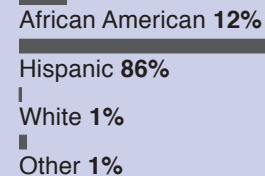

Joseph Jungman Elementary School

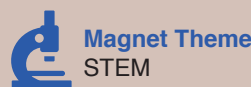

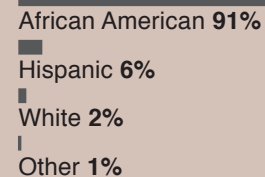
