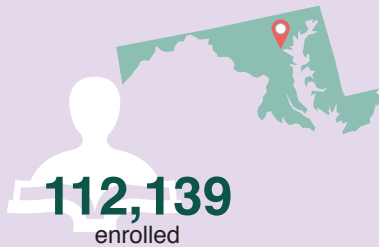
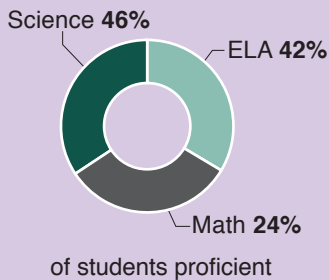
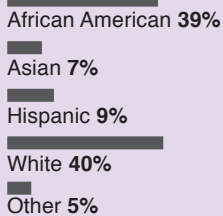

Project Overview

Board of Education of Baltimore County, Baltimore County Public Schools, is creating a vertical magnet pathway in International Baccalaureate and health sciences by converting three middle schools, one high school, and one elementary school from traditional programs to whole-school magnet programs, and significantly revising one high school magnet program from a partial program to a whole-school program. The Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP)-funded project provides unique curricula and rigorous academics that incorporate research-based strategies to attract and meet the needs of diverse students. The schools are implementing new interdisciplinary curriculum and fostering theme-related partnerships with community organizations.

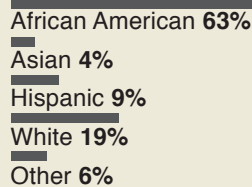
