



Project Overview

CodeRVA Regional High School is a new regional magnet high school that uses innovative instructional approaches and rethinks school time, learning space, and classroom technology to provide students with college and career readiness opportunities in the computer science field. The school serves students from 13 school districts in the Greater Richmond Core Based Statistical Area, which encompasses sixteen counties that include the city of Richmond as well as smaller cities. Operating as a year-round school, the Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP)-funded program opened in September 2017 to ninth and tenth graders and will enroll students each year to serve 400 students in grades 9-12 by 2020-21. Partnerships with community colleges offer students access to college coursework through dual enrollment that enables students to graduate with a high school diploma and an associate's degree. In addition, area employers help students develop the digital knowledge and skills that lead to industry certifications and/or paid work experience in computer science-related fields. The school helps diverse students be independent leaders and lifelong learners, and uses cooperative real-world projects to facilitate student agency and prepare students for college and careers.
