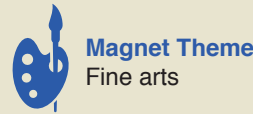
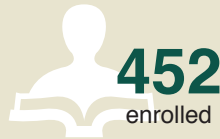


Project Overview

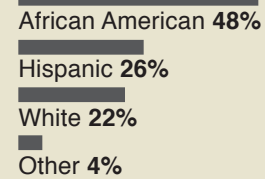

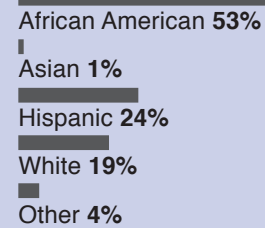

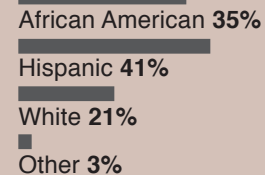
