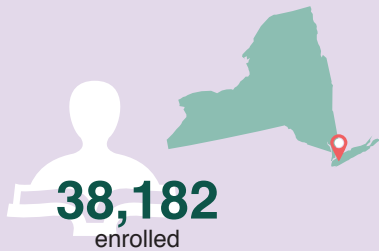
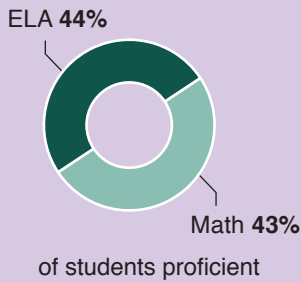
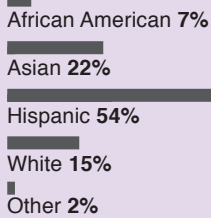

## Project Overview

New York City Community School District 30, in consortium with New York City Community School District 25, is revising two existing magnet schools and converting two traditional schools into whole-school magnet programs. These four new school choice options use project-based learning approaches, professional development, and parent engagement strategies to provide high-quality theme-based instruction and curricula to increase student achievement. These Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP)-funded schools are creating diverse learning environments by attracting students from different racial/ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds – a strategy designed to foster interactions among students and improve understanding and skills.

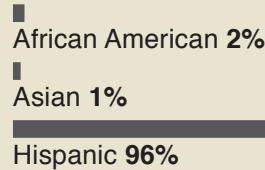
